





Dear Parents,

It has been a big week for us here at St Katharine's. After much preparation and painstaking thinking through around the logistics of school re-opening, we finally welcomed the Year 6 children back to school on Wednesday along with the children of some of our Key Workers, joined on Thursday by Year 1 and our Reception learners on Friday morning.

We are using every available space to accommodate these groups of children and we have been keen to ensure that school still feels like school, albeit with tables set further apart and socially distanced drop off and collection routines. ParentMail – Forms

You are all now successfully receiving letters by ParentMail and the next phase is for you to be able to respond to a form online using ParentMail 'Forms'. We have trialled a couple of these with some groups of parents; one for those of you sending YR, Y1 and Y6 back to school and another for parents of the current Year 3 who we are hoping will be going to Oxenwood on their rescheduled residential in September. As things begin to return to something resembling normality please look out for messages from ParentMail that tell you that you have a form to complete. We are still planning to roll out the option to pay for items via ParentMail. We will launch this as and when we are all back under one roof.
