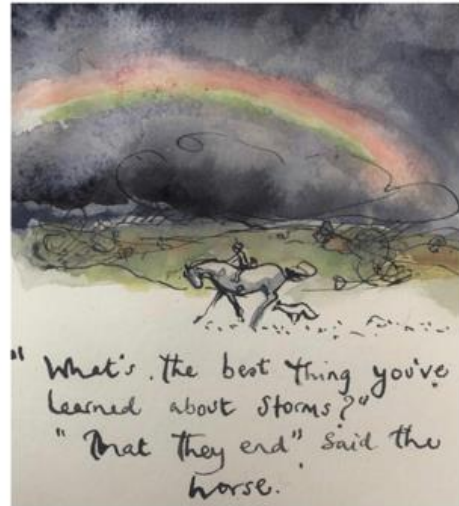
Dear Parents,

If it were to become apparent that a longer conversation is necessary teachers will make sure that this happens at another time.

Appointment of Governors

Please note that if you have a child in Year 6 who will be transitioning to secondary school at the end of this academic year, you needed to have completed the application process by 31st October. Please do not hesitate to get in touch if you have

Face coverings for staff NOT children

As a result of the new national restrictions which came into place on Thursday this week, there have inevitably been a few adjustments to the recommendations for schools. One of those has been that Primary schools can elect for adults working in the school environment to wear face coverings when keeping a 2m distance is not possible and when walking in communal areas. We already have procedures in place to ensure that, where possible, staff are not crossing bubbles. There are exceptions to this when the education of the children cannot take place without it. Our academy trust has decided that we will adopt this measure and so I write to tell you that from Monday 9th November all adults working in school will wear a face covering when in communal spaces that are not their main working space. We **will not** be wearing face coverings when teaching and in classrooms and there is **no advice** at this time for us to implement the wearing of face coverings by children.

We will be talking to the children about this on Monday in our collective worship and helping them to understand the reason for this change. We aim to manage this calmly and in such a way that the children are comfortable and happy with it.

Ventilating Classrooms

Since returning to school in September we have ensured that classrooms are well ventilated; windows and doors (where possible) are kept open during the school day. We continue to heat the classrooms but understand that children may find the learning environment less comfortable than is usual. Children are invited to wear coats if they need to and we urge you to layer up your children with long-sleeved vests and T-shirts if you know that they feel the cold. Ventilation is really important in keeping us all as safe as possible, not least our teaching and support staff who remain a very precious commodity to us all.
