#### **Staffing Update**

#### **Hot Water Bottles and Blankets**

You may have seen in the Gazette and Herald an article about council-run libraries in Wiltshire giving out free thermal clothing and blankets to those in need. The 'warm packs' which are being offered as part of a partnership between Warm and Safe Wiltshire and The Rural Communities Energy Support Network, will be available to collect at all Wiltshire Council libraries from this winter. Each pack will contain a scarf, thermal hat and gloves, fleece blanket and a hot water bottle with cover, and there is no criteria that must be met to be able to collect one. The libraries are also open as official 'warm spaces' for those in need of friendly support or shelter through the cost-of-living crisis. We are forwarding this information in case it is of use to you or anyone you know.

#### **Online Safety Evening**

Thank you to those of you that came into school on Tuesday evening to learn a bit more from the team at Wiltshire Policy about supporting children to stay safe online but also how we, as adults, can make changes that will ensure better cyber security for us.

(No uniforms, workwear, pillows, duvets or pieces of fabric please)


