#### Dear Parents.

It's been super busy for the last couple of weeks. I do wonder sometimes how we manage to fit everything in; schools are busy places and the last fortnight has been no exception.

Sycamore Class took part in the local school Tag Rugby tournament on Marlborough Common last week. They did exceptionally well and as always played with great sports-person-ship. We are extremely grateful to Tom Swift, Chris Coates and Will Howell who gave up their Friday evenings to run a rugby club after school, to support the preparation for this event. We have a PE document that outlines what we aim for PE to be like at St Katharines. It begins with this quote by Jeremy Frisch:

'Do not be alarmed, you may hear loud noises, shrieks, shouts and squeals. You may see big smiles, sweaty hair and red faces. Side effects include: good mood, strong heart and muscles, better grades and quality sleep...'

If you had watched the children as they took part in this club the above quote would have summed it up perfectly!

The arts have had centre stage this week. On Wednesday we had a whole school assembly led by the group 'Ultimate Tuition'. This music roadshow has a focus on introducing children to the instruments that feature in most modern music: the drum kit, bass, electric and acoustic guitar. The group introduced us to the idea of body percussion and how simple clapping rhythms, set to music can

have incredible musical effects. Chestnut class then had an hour-long workshop, exploring the instruments and musical ideas in greater depth. It was great to have live music in school. Last night our drama club performed their slightly spooky murder mystery play to a small audience of parents. They have been working on this over a period of weeks with Lizzie (Tall Tales) who runs the club. They developed the play themselves using improvisation techniques. The performance was immersive; with cast involving the audience at points in the performance. It was lovely to see the children have such ownership of their work and to see them having so much fun at the same time. Our busy week ended with another performance, this time by the choir. Again, they have been building towards this over a period of weeks and today parents were invited in to share their work. I can confirm it was a real treat and a wonderful way to start the day. Thank you to all parents who have taken the time out of their busy days to pop in and share those performances with their children. They love having you there!

I can't quite believe that we have only four days of term left. We are looking forward to seeing you all at 9:30am on Thursday morning to share our Easter Service with you. The PTA would like to invite parents back to school after the event for tea, coffee and hot cross buns and for you to enjoy the Easter Bonnet Parade. Keep those fingers crossed for some fine weather!

#### **Parent Evenings**

We have had quite a few requests for parents' evening appointments outside of the times we have planned for. Please understand that the calendar gets extremely busy. Teaching staff have a wide range of commitments outside of their designated teaching time involving meetings and training alongside their everyday planning, preparation and assessment. It can be very difficult to accommodate individual requests for face-toface meetings and if we are not careful the parent evening window can stretch on for weeks. We work extremely hard to ensure that important dates such as this, where parents need as much advance warning as possible, are in your diary at the beginning of the school year. All of the parents evening dates for 23-24 were sent out in the Key Dates Planner in July last year.

We strive to be a school that listens and responds. If you have concerns, please know that we will always arrange meetings with you to address them. Parents' evenings are a chance to update you on progress, share successes and keep you informed; please do your best to book appointments in the time we have allowed for that. Thank you for your help with this. The final parents' evenings of the school year (after those taking place next week) will be on 9<sup>th</sup> and 11<sup>th</sup> July from 3:30 – 5:00. This parents' evening will come after end of year reports have been sent out. We run this evening as an optional parents evening with the primary aim of parents having the

opportunity to talk through any issues having received that report.

#### Scootability

Unfortunately, the Scootability sessions that were scheduled to take place on **12**<sup>th</sup> **March** had to be cancelled due to inclement weather.

We are happy to report that we have rescheduled this event and it is now in the diary on **Wednesday 1**<sup>st</sup> **May**. If you had signed your child up to take part, we will be in touch.

#### **Lego Exhibition and Fundraiser**

We enter a year 6 team in a Lego Robotics competition each year and would very much like them to go to the competition next year with the latest Lego Robot. In support of next year's team, we are hoping to raise a bit of money towards buying the robot. We are holding a Lego Exhibition in the school hall on Friday 26th April. There will be a prize for each class. So as not to limit creativity, we are asking children to create 'something' out of Lego that can be displayed within the space of an A4 piece of paper. We are asking that each exhibit has a title or short description to go with it and that these are Lego creations built **from scratch** and **not** something made from a Lego Kit. We are also asking for a whole school bake so that those that attend the exhibition can also enjoy a cake! All baked items will be warmly welcome. If people would like to follow the Lego theme into their cooking, please feel free! The Exhibition and cake sale will be in the school hall all afternoon, from 2:00pm onwards. Parents, grandparents, aunts and uncles can come at any time from 2:00pm to enjoy the Children's creations. There will be a voluntary donation on the door in support of our goal to buy the newest Lego Robot. We have a target to reach of £500 that the children, with the support of the PTA, are working towards.

#### **Road Update**

We had what we hope will turn out to be a significant meeting at school this week involving, myself, our governors, our school business manager, Excalibur head of estates, the council and Ramsbury Estates. I share your frustration with the lack of progress towards resolving the issues with potholes and road drainage. It has been a laborious 18months – 2 years, involving many emails, phone calls and conversations and meetings and not a few broken promises. We are hopeful that we have reached a solution that involves a proper sustainable patching of the worst section of road (near the carpark) and a drainage solution that will ensure that the newer road surface will remain

intact irrespective of the weather. I do not have a date for you yet, but we hope to see that achieved in the next couple of months.

When I have more news, I will share it with you.

#### Slight Change to Head Injury Reporting

We have made a slight change to our processes for reporting head injuries. We will send home a letter explaining what to look out for in terms of concussion, a red wrist band and we will follow up with a phone call. We will no longer provide a copy of the accident report. If you wish to see that brief report, please request a copy.




