#### Dear Parents,

It has been a very busy couple of weeks. When I sat down to collate the events that had happened over the course of the last fortnight, I needed at least two post-it notes for my list!

Last week began with our school remembrance service in church. The children in Sycamore Class led the service beautifully, providing some context for why we mark this very special day and sharing some poignant readings to help us understand the impact that war has on ordinary lives. Thank you to them and Mr Sandall for putting this service together.

Oak Class have been looking at food in their design and technology block. This block has been brought to life by our very own Dr Parkinson (Lilla and Freddie) who came in to school to lead a session on 'eating the rainbow' and the importance of good food to our health and wellbeing. The children tasted a wide range of delicious fruit and vegetables, some for the very first time. Huge thanks to him for taking the time out of his busy life to support this learning in the classroom.

With anti-bullying week and Children in Need coinciding in the same week last week, we had two opportunities to place ourselves in the shoes of others. Thank you to our parent community in supporting Odd Socks Day and The Heaviest Backpack campaign. The back packs were truly uplifting!

The charity Restless Development have been in again to deliver an assembly to Key Stage 2, promoting the triathlon that will be held this year on **Sunday 18<sup>th</sup> May** at Marlborough College. Children need to form teams of four, give themselves a silly name, and ideally do a bit of training before the big day. There is an entry

requirement that children raise £50 for the charity to take part. Any money raised over and above that will go to the PTA. It is a great event to be a part of. Attached to this newsletter are two documents giving information about how to get involved and a flyer for those of you who might be interested in helping on the day. My only reservation about this event is the occasional trickiness about making a team and ensuring that everyone who wants to take part, can. Children can make teams of 5 if needed (children will not do all 3 events) or teams of 3 (children will need to do an additional event). This is very much 'over to you', a parent organised and supported event. I hope everyone who is keen to get involved is included in a team.

Our handball team travelled *all the way* to Burbage last week to take part in a local handball tournament. We were triumphant, narrowly beating Easton Royal in the very last game. Mrs Crocker, who accompanied the team, reports that they were a pleasure to take. Lovely also to see some of our children really grow in confidence as the tournament progressed which is exactly the point of taking part in them.

Today Chestnut Class had a workshop and scientific discovery day at Winchester Science Museum. I am reliably told that they were exceptionally well behaved and enjoyed all the activities on offer; perhaps especially the slime making element of the day! This trip supports the block of learning that they have recently been emersed in called 'changing states of matter', an early delve into the wonders of chemistry!

We certainly do pack it in... I can't promise any let up as we approach December. You all know what's coming round the corner! Hang on to your (Santa) hats!

#### **Attendance Update**

There have been a lot of children off with bugs during the previous 2-week period. This obviously affects our attendance figures. However, as always we are grateful to parents for taking a considered approach to whether to send in children who may be under the weather. Please know that we will always monitor children who seem unwell and if necessary give you a call to collect if we feel they would benefit from being at home.

#### What to do when your child is unwell - a refresh

We believe that good attendance and punctuality give our children the best opportunity for success both academically and personally thus helping towards developing their skills for life. All children deserve to be able to make the most of the opportunities available to them at St Katharine's.

If your child is unwell, we ask that you call the school office on the first day of the illness to explain your child's absence. If you know that the absence is likely to be for a couple of days (48 hours for a sickness/diarrhoea bug, 24hours after a temperature spike) please let us know during the course of this telephone call /message. If you are not certain when your child is returning to school, we would expect you to keep us updated on a daily basis, before the beginning of each school day. This can be done by leaving an answerphone message or by sending an email. When leaving a message on the school answerphone or sending an email, detailing an absence, please give a brief description of the illness. If we do not receive notification about your child's absence, we will call you to enquire as to why your child is not in school. This is in line with recommended safeguarding procedures.

If you are requesting that your child have time away from school for reasons not related to illness, please request a form from the school office.

Medical or other appointments in school time should be avoided if at all possible but if not a leave of absence form must be obtained from the school office. A half day is considered sufficient for most appointments.

Thank you for your help with this.


