#### **Early Morning Turning Circle**

I understand the need for a prompt start to your day and the thinking behind an early arrival. The problem that we have had recently is that staff arriving in readiness for an 8:30 start have not been able to park in the staff carpark due to the turning circle traffic blocking entrances. Please be mindful that before 8:30 staff still need access to the carpark.

#### **Attendance Update**

#### Current whole school attendance data: 95.9% Our end of year attendance target is: 97%

There have been a lot of children off with bugs during the previous 2-week period. This obviously affects our attendance figures. However, we are grateful to parents for taking a considered approach to whether to send in children who may be under the weather. Please know that we will always monitor children who seem unwell and if necessary give you a call to collect if we feel they are really not well enough to be here. We are delighted with the response of our parent community to the national changes in the approach to school attendance. There is a real sense that you are taking attendance very seriously and that you understand the clear link between strong attendance and the benefits for children's learning. Thank you for working with us and understanding these changes in the

context of a shared desire for all children to thrive while at school.

#### **Meetings at School**

Throughout the year we offer several meetings at school to parents of different year groups. These are intended to provide an opportunity for parents to get involved and raise awareness of relevant subjects, such as reading and maths, to assist you in providing support to your child/ren at home. We encourage you to attend these meetings when they are made available. We recently conducted a survey of KS2 parents following a reading meeting which was relatively poorly attended. Thank you to those of you who took the time to respond. We will go through the responses and consider the feedback carefully.

#### **Parents' Evenings**

Thank you to all of you who booked and attended a parents' evening last week. We hope that this meeting, combined with the opportunity to come into school and share your child's learning prior to the meeting with your child's teacher, has given you an insight into their progress and areas for development and support. Please know that if you have any concerns, that you feel you would like to discuss in greater depth, our teachers are always happy to arrange a face-to-face meeting with you at a mutually convenient time.

#### **Nine Lesson Service**

A group of more than 20 Key Stage 2 children have been rehearsing at school for the Nine Lessons Service at St. Katharine's Church on Sunday 15<sup>th</sup> December. The children will be singing a hymn at the service. Please do go along and support them. The service starts at 6pm and is always followed by mince pies and mulled wine.

#### Drumming!

A local drumming teacher will be attending an assembly on Friday next week. Following the assembly, further information will be sent out to the relevant year groups introducing drumming to our music tuition offering.

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
