Dear Parents,

This letter brings us neatly to the end of January. Not long until we are once again woken up by birds singing and a bit of light in the sky! We have had a busy couple of weeks. Oak class have been exploring their learning out of the classroom with a trip to the STEAM museum in Swindon last week. This trip, organised by Miss Denton, supports the learning that they have been doing around the theme of 'Transport' with specific focus on the engineers Isambard Kingdom Brunel and John Rennie, both significant historical figures in the development of rail and canal transport in the UK. Yesterday this learning was followed up by a brilliant session, brought right to our school hall, by the education team at Crofton Beam Engine. The children learnt all about how steam engines were a vital part of the building of canals and especially in the creation of the Beam Engine. They made their own canals in the hall and used a range of materials to represent the boats and the locks that you find there.

Our new group of drummers had their first lessons yesterday. I wasn't here yesterday afternoon to hear their first lessons through the walls of my office... I look forward to that next week! I am genuinely really delighted to be able to offer this tuition to the children and add another instrument to our peripatetic offer. We have 13 children learning at the moment. A Memorial Service for Mrs Crewe

Our sincere thanks, once again, for the support and love that you have shared with us over the last few weeks. It has certainly been a very difficult few weeks, navigating the loss of a much-treasured member of our small team whilst keeping things as near to normal as we have been able to manage for the children.

We are staying in close contact with her family, who have visited the school a couple of times recently to meet with the staff and again at the weekend to see the things that the children have been making for the tree and visit the prayer space in church. They have asked me to pass on their heartfelt thanks for all of the memories and kind messages that you have shared with them and for the attendance at the funeral by so many of you. I know it meant a great deal. As part of those conversations, we have shared with them our desire to hold a Memorial Service and celebration of life for Mrs Crewe. We very much want to offer the opportunity for our community to come together, share memories and give thanks for everything that she brought to our community. Our plan is for this to be in the evening on Thursday 3rd April at 5:00pm, enabling as many of you to come as possible and for past students and their families to be included. We hope to offer refreshments back at school after the service for everyone in attendance. We are in the very early stages of planning; for now, put the date in your calendars and plan to wear your most colourful clothes. We would be very grateful if you could spread the news to our past families. It would be wonderful to fill the church.

Let us know if someone else is picking up your child

If you have planned for someone else to pick up your child in an emergency or out of the normal pattern for your family, please take the time to inform your child's class teacher by emailing the school office or leaving a message. We are not able to let children leave with an adult if it is out of the ordinary for your family or we haven't been informed. Please note this does not include those adults such as grandparents etc... who pick up in a regular slot each week and when we are already aware of that arrangement.

Parking/turning circle

Having been out on the turning circle quite regularly recently I would like to ask for your support with the following.

- Please do not let children out of the car prior to 8:30 – when an adult arrives on duty
- Please wait until you are parallel with the school buildings before letting children out of cars; children are getting out alongside the hedge where visibility is limited, this could be very dangerous.
- Please aim for children to be ready on arrival so that they can get out promptly and ideally without the need for lots of help from an adult.

The turning circle does work, and my hope is that it saves you time. Please try to be patient with each other and follow the simple rules above. It will be like witnessing a well-oiled machine in motion!

Military/Service Families check

We need to record on our information system where our families have a parent working as service personnel. This information is fed through into the school census and, where appropriate, triggers qualification for Service Pupil Premium (SPP). This premium enables schools to provide extra support for children with parents in the Armed Forces. Therefore, if this applies to you, please remember to either notify the office or update your Bromcom profile.

Playing after school

From time to time, we need to send out a reminder about the use of the playground after school. Please know that we understand the value that this small bit of the day has on fostering and building a sense of community; we don't have a village playground that everyone can go to by way of an alternative. Please know also that allowing children to stay and play on school premises out of school hours is an exception. Most schools close their gates quite promptly at the end of the day. In support of that fact, please ensure that children are playing kindly, with care for each other and the play equipment and that they are doing so safely and under your supervision. Other than the static

equipment, no other equipment should be used after school. Please also ensure that children are not playing on the field out of sight. Staying and playing at the end of the day is limited to the bark and hard standing play area. As the days begin to lengthen, we ask that everyone has left the playground by 4:00pm at the latest (unless you are waiting for a club to finish, in which case 4:15).

NHS Pharmacy First Service

Did you know that the NHS Pharmacy First Service enables children and adults to get convenient access to healthcare advice and treatment where appropriate, for seven common conditions without the potential delay of having to wait for a GP appointment? Accessing the service may mean that can help children feel better and back to school as quickly as possible, as well as supporting parents/carers to also get better if they are unwell with one of the conditions covered under the service.

There is no need to make an appointment; parents or carers can pop into their local Boots pharmacy with their child and ask for help under the service

Support for the following conditions can be accessed under the service, free of charge (unless NHS prescription charges apply):

Common condition	Patient eligibility
Earache	1 to 17 years
Impetigo	1 year and over
Infected insect bites and stings	1 year and over
Sore throats	5 years and over
Sinusitis	12 years and over
Uncomplicated urinary tract	Women 16 to 64 years
Shingles	18 years and over
