Savernake Fun Run

We are thrilled to announce that the Savernake Fun Run will return this summer on <u>Saturday</u> **28**th **June 2025**.

This will be the fifth Savernake Fun Run hosted by St Katharine's Primary School, with the last event taking place back in July 2019! As with previous events, the event is open to the whole family with 10km and 3km distances available.

Both races start and finish on the field at St. Katharine's Primary School and, with the kind permission of Mr Rokos and with the support of the Estate Manager and Security team from Tottenham House, the new route takes runners through beautiful private fields and woodland that is not generally open to the public, with stunning views of the Wiltshire countryside. There will be winner prizes in both adult and child categories plus every competitor will receive a custom-made medal on completion.

As usual, there will be tea/coffee, delicious cakes and bacon sandwiches on the school field for runners and supporters! This has typically been a hugely popular event, attracting interest from the school community but also wider running groups, with competitors joining us from as far as Bath! All funds raised from the event will go to the St Katharine's PTA to support the school.
