Attendance Update

Current whole school attendance data: 96.1% Our end of year attendance target is: 97%

We have just completed the <u>third</u> of <u>six</u> planned attendance audits this academic year. Whilst we are still experiencing the usual winter illnesses along with a recent bout of chickenpox, we are really pleased with our attendance data so far this year. We are not far off our end of year target of 97% and our attendance compares favourably to both national and Wiltshire attendance data. It would be brilliant to achieve our end of year target of 97%. I hope the onset of Spring might help us achieve this. Thank you for your continued support and for taking on board the new changes to legislation.
